

THINK-TAC-TOE- Entering Grade 7

<p>State the theme of the book you've read. Using text evidence and elaboration to support it, write a well-developed essay that includes an introductory and conclusion paragraph.</p>	<p>Track a character throughout the novel. Identify three character traits and provide evidence for each. How does your character change?</p>	<p>Create two poems that strongly relate to the text that you have read. Your poem should have at least twelve lines, figurative, and descriptive language. Underline and label your examples of figurative language.</p>
<p>Find two news articles that relate to a social issue within your book. Summarize and reflect upon each article. Include the articles with your summary and reflection. Be sure to identify how the articles link to your novel.</p>	<p>Create a commercial (video) or a print ad for your book. Include information about the text. It should include a summary and a recommendation. Your ad should persuade others to read the novel.</p>	<p>Visit a website that relates to your book, such as the author's website or one that focuses on an important setting of your book. Write an entry that shows how the website helped you to better understand your book.</p>
<p>Create a book club that meets at least twice. Record when your meetings took place, who was there, and what you discussed.</p>	<p>Develop a response about social issues that includes identifying the issue, explaining how the character dealt with the issue, and what lesson the reader learned about this issue.</p>	<p>Illustrate three important scenes in your book. Include a description for each scene and why you chose to illustrate those scenes.</p>

You will need to choose **THREE** of the above choices that create a line (as in tic-tac-toe). All work needs to be typed and printed out for the first week of school.

Remember: You must read two books. You must complete two boxes for one book and an additional box for the second book.
